MINUTES COUNCIL MEETING FEBRUARY 12, 2013

The Centerville town council met in regular session on Tuesday, February 12, 2013, in the Municipal Building, 204 E. Main St., Centerville, Indiana.

The meeting was called to order 7:07 p.m. with Pres. Wandersee presiding.

MOTION to approve the minutes of January 8, 2013, was made by Pres. Wandersee and seconded by Council Johnson-Keep. With all in favor and no abstentions, motion carried.

MOTION to pay the bills was made by Pres. Wandersee and seconded by Council Crawley. With all in favor and no abstentions, motion carried.

The Centerville Christian Church would like to plan activities at Maplewood Park during the summer on the following dates:

The church would need electricity and would furnish food such as hot dogs, etc. **MOTION to approve this request** was made by Council Widau and seconded by Council Dillman. Ordinance 2012-05 was introduced and discussed at previous meetings and is now back for a third and final reading. "It shall be the policy of the Town of Centerville to provide, within constitutional limitation, for fair housing throughout its corporate limits as provided for under the federal Civil Rights Act of 1968, as amended, the federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and Indiana Code 22-9.5-1 et. seq." **MOTION on Ordinance 2012-05 Fair Housing to go to third and final reading by title only** was made by Council Crawley and seconded by Council Johnson-Keep. Title read by Council Crawley. With all in favor and no abstentions, motion carried.

Gene Kates gave the building commissioner report: One sign report - \$35; two building permits-\$140 for a total of three permits at \$175.

Police Chief Ed Buchholz gave the police department report. Criminal Investigations: 4 theft; 1 criminal mischief; 1 operating while intoxicated; 1 harassment; 1 truancy; 1 check fraud; 1 child molestation. Arrests include: 1 operator never licensed; 1 driving while license suspended; 2 possession of marijuana; 1 dealing marijuana; 2 minor consuming alcoholic beverage; 1 disorderly conduct; 1 battery; 1 domestic battery; 1 battery on a police officer; 1 public intoxication; 1 possession of paraphernalia; 1 warrant arrest. K-9 usage-9 (includes 1 arrest for dealing in marijuana as a result of using K-9 on a traffic stop). There were 3 total accidents investigated; 36 total vehicle stops; 11 state tickets issued; 1 warning ticket issued; 183 total calls; 4,669 total mileage.

MOTION to close under General was made by President Wandersee and seconded by Council Johnson-Keep. With all in favor and no abstentions, motion carried.

STREET DEPARTMENT
